7 Top Tips For Equestrian Photography

- 1. Make sure the horse is clean especially the face and nose, wipe those eyes and remove any loose artifacts from the mane.**
- 2. If you are using an iPhone or Android device you will have distortion if taking close up shots.**

These can look creative but keep in mind the horses head will look out of proportion to the rest of the body.

- 3. Avoid taking photographs looking straight on. Have the horse standing at an angle and try stepping back to take a full length portrait.**
- 4. Keep a constant look out for that fun shot, the tongue out or showing teeth like the horse is laughing.**

- 5. Try to encourage the horse to stand correctly with head held high and ears forward.**
- 6. Use a variety of backgrounds, keep the background simple, avoid bright coloured bins or barrows in the background.**

7. Take lots and lots of photographs, only keep the good ones and bin the rest.
